### The Froebelian Approach at LTNS Reflecting Five Years On...

In the Autumn of 2017 we embarked on a journey that would begin a new era for the nursery schools. The Froebelian approach was introduced to us through training delivered by Froebelian Travelling Tutors. Since then, all educators at LTNS receive training which ensures they fully

understand what it means to teach and learn in a Froebelian setting. As we reflect on the past five years it is clear to see how the approach guides us all to learn alongside the children, build on what came before and tackle unknown futures.

At LTNS reflection is part of our daily work, but time can often be against us. Within the last five years we have been through social and global changes, inclusive of a worldwide pandemic. We are not protected in the early years sector from

the lasting impacts that come with such events, yet we must learn to adapt and continue to prepare children for a future which is as unpredictable as ever. It can be difficult to partake in deep reflection, similar to meditation. It takes practice, patience and the hope that you'll come out the other side with

answers or new throughts to guide you through the next phase of work or life or both. Looking back can better prepare us for what's to come. Learning from our own and others' experience is how we grow and develop. Having a framework to guide our planning is vital to that process. Froebel was no stranger to struggle and quotes that nothing comes without it. We choose to think of struggle as part of the learning process, the moment just before a baby rolls over after much persistence. The links being made as toddlers discover new words. The small worlds being created from blocks by pre-schoolers. Taking the time to reflect on these milestones keeps us focused on what is most important;

each individual childs own experience. The beauty of the Froebelian approach is the ability to slow down and focus on the little things (which are actually the big things) and make sure we are tuned in to the children, the environment, the community and each other. The principles allow us to ask ourselves

important questions, to strive to know and understand more whilst always putting the children at the center. The past five years have taught us that change is inevitable, we cannot control what happens outside of LTNS. But we can ensure that we learn and evolve. As Froebel says 'That which follows is always conditioned upon that which goes before'. We must always remember what came before and never forget to celebrate where we are now.

## Friedrich Froebel

(1782-1852)

- Friedrich Froebel was a German educator whose work focused on the individual lived experiences of children
- He believed in child-centred education and saw play as fundamental to children's development
- He created the 'kindergarten' and was passionate about nature, the outdoors and the rich first hand experiences it offers young children

Froebel wanted to 'educate people to be free, to think, to take action for themselves'

To ensure the Froebelian approach is relevant today, early years scholars (including Prof Tina Bruce, Helen Tovey and the Froebel Trust) have translated his work creating a set of principles which underpin the framework for early years practice.

At LTNS we follow the principles written by Helen Tovey. These are:

- Respect
- Community
- Connectedness
- Learning and Development
- Creativity
- Environment
- Positive Relationships
- Well Qualified Early Years Professionals

## **Open Call For Parent Participation**

Chloe (Head of Training and QA) and Monika (Training assistant) successfully acquired a grant from the Froebel Trust to support research at LTNS. The project title is 'How does furthering knowledge of the Froebelian approach impact the relationships within our nursery community?' A key part of this project is parent participation. We believe that furthering knowledge of the Froebelian approach and early childhood development, as well as building and sustaining positive, trusting relationships between parents and teachers will result in a community who understand and question the quality and type of education that their children receive.

Two intersecting areas will need to be measured within this research, firstly the quality/type of relationships before, during and after the project and secondly, the level of expansion of knowledge of both parents and teachers during this process.
